PRINCIPAL NEWS

Welcome to 2021!

It was wonderful to see our students returning from their holidays refreshed and ready to learn.

Over the next three weeks, all class teachers will be contacting parents via phone to introduce themselves and to discuss your child. As each teacher will be calling all parents from their class, we have allocated 5-10 minutes per phone call. If you require longer than the phone call allows, teachers are more than willing to meet with you in person if necessary. Part of our school plan is community engagement and that means maintaining regular contact with families. We're looking forward to working with you to support the educational needs of all our students. There will be ALOT of information coming your way in the coming weeks. It involves our school plan as well as information about staff roles across our school. Thank you for abiding by the updated COVID guidelines. We have reverted back to 2020 guidelines where parents need to remain outside school grounds for drop off and pick up. Kindergarten parents are able to drop off on their first two days (Thursday and Friday this week). If you need to enter school grounds, you must sign an external visitors form and scan the Service NSW code in the front office. We are still able to meet with you as long as it has been arranged. Afternoon pick up in the Cudgera Avenue car park is effective and efficient when only parents of students in K, 1 and 2 arrive first. Parents picking up students in Years 3-6 are asked to come after 3.05pm. This includes if you have a child in 3-6 and in K-2. Please come after 3.05pm so both your children will be ready for pick up. K, 1 and 2 students come to pick up first and if parents of older children arrive early, it creates a bottle neck in our car park. Thanks for your cooperation! Years 1-6 have commenced in their new classes and all classes were put together taking into account student requests, parent requests and staff expertise. We have formed 23 classes across K-6. Our Kindergarten students commence on Thursday 4 February.

More information will be shared about our processes and procedures on a regular basis. It will create consistency and a common language in our school across all settings.

Our first school event is taking place on Monday 8 February and is our annual swimming carnival. Due to COVID restrictions, we are only able to take competitive and competent swimmers on the day. It will be school as normal for those students not attending.

Thanks to all our new Kindergarten students and families who attended their Best Start appointments. The Kindergarten teachers enjoyed meeting everyone. Kindergarten will start their first day on Thursday 4 February. Due to COVID restrictions, we will have staggered start times in place for Thursday 4 and Friday 5 February.

The start times are as follows -

9.15am - Last name A-Ma

9.45am - Last name Mc-Z

Parents and caregivers will need to sign in at the front gate before heading to the hall. Students will meet their buddies who will take them to the Kindergarten rooms.

Our school day ends at 3.00pm. Students will be walked to the front gate for pick up. If you have made other arrangements with pick up, please let the Kindergarten teachers or front office know.

Passive Play - Activities will be set up in the school hall for Kindergarten students from 8.30am to 9.00am starting Monday 8 February. This will assist with our Kindergarten students transitioning to school. Parents are asked to drop students at the front gate and a teacher will be there to walk groups of students to the hall where they will meet their buddy and enjoy playing with them and their peers until school starts at 9.00am.

Get to school safely - Starting school means lots of changes for you and your child. It is crucial to plan and talk about safe travel to and from school with your child.

Until your child is at least eight years old, hold their hand:

- on the footpath
- in the car park
- when crossing the road

Up until at least 10 years old, supervise your child very closely, holding their hand when crossing the road. If a hand isn't available they should hold an arm, bag, clothes or the pram.
